## God's Promise: A Blessed Nation, and a Blessing for All Nations

**GENESIS 12:2–3** 2 "I will make you into a great nation, and I will bless you; I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing. 3 I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you."

### **MATTHEW 1:1** "Jesus the Messiah the son of David, the son of Abraham"

# **God's Promise: Land Inheritance in Canaan**

## **GENESIS 12:6—7**

6 Abram traveled through the land as far as the site of the great tree of Moreh at Shechem. At that time the Canaanites were in the land. 7 The Lord appeared to Abram and said, "To your offspring I will give this land."

# God's Promise: Innumerable Descendants

# GENESIS 15:5

## 5 He took him outside and said, "Look up at the sky and count the stars-if indeed you can count them." Then he said to him, "So shall your offspring be."

# **Genesis is a historical narrative.**

We shouldn't read Genesis as prescriptive, but rather as an accounting of past events in story form with characters, plots, settings, scenes, dialogue —stories told in an order to help us understand how God is advancing his plan for the restoration of mankind through one family.

**GENESIS 25:24-26** "When the time came for her to give birth, there were twin boys in her womb. The first to come out was red, and his whole body was like a hairy garment; so they named him Esau. After this, his brother came out, with his hand grasping Esau's heel; so he was named Jacob. Isaac was sixty years old when Rebekah gave birth to them."

# Jacob means <u>he grasps</u> <u>the heel</u>, a Hebrew idiom for <u>he deceives</u>.

# We see <u>deception</u> as a running theme in Abraham's family.

# There's also the issue of polygamy.



### DEUTERONOMY 17:17 "He must not take many wives, or his heart will be led astray."

**1 TIMOTHY 3:1-2** The saying is trustworthy: If anyone aspires to the office of overseer, he desires a noble task. 2 Therefore an overseer must be above reproach, the husband of one wife\*, sober-minded, self-controlled, respectable, hospitable, able to teach,

\*Literally: <u>a man of one woman</u>

### **GENESIS 2:24** That is why a man leaves his father and mother and is united to <u>his wife</u>, and they become one flesh.

### Wife, not wives

### **EPHESIANS 5:33** However, each one of you also must love <u>his wife</u> as he loves himself, and the wife must respect her husband.

### Wife, not wives

# Why were people who did bad things blessed?

A <u>covenant</u> is a legally binding agreement between two parties. It is often solemnized or ratified by an oath or other means and usually places demands on one or both parties.

God's Promises to **Abraham:**  Bless him and bless all peoples through him • Give his descendants the land of Canaan • Multiply his descendants into a great nation

God's Commands to Abraham: Believe God and follow him fully • Circumcise his descendants as an entry point into the covenant

**ROMANS 9:6-7** 6 It is not as though God's word had failed. For not all who are descended from Israel are Israel. 7 Nor because they are his descendants are they all Abraham's children. On the contrary, "It is through Isaac that your offspring will be reckoned."

**ROMANS 9:8-13** 8 In other words, it is not the children by physical descent who are God's children, but it is the children of the promise who are regarded as Abraham's offspring. 9 For this was how the promise was stated: "At the appointed time I will return, and Sarah will have a son."

**ROMANS 9:8-13** 10 Not only that, but Rebekah's children were conceived at the same time by our father Isaac. 11 Yet, before the twins were born or had done anything good or bad-in order that God's purpose in election might stand: 12 not by works but by him who calls -she was told, "The older will serve the younger." 13 Just as it is written: "Jacob I loved, but Esau I hated."

**MALACHI 1:1-3** A prophecy: The word of the Lord to Israel through Malachi. 2 "I have loved you," says the Lord. "But you ask, 'How have you loved us?' "Was not Esau Jacob's brother?" declares the Lord. "Yet I have loved Jacob, 3 but Esau I have hated, and I have turned his hill country into a wasteland and left his inheritance to the desert jackals."

### **ARUR** Cursed: separation from God and the community of faith

**ROMANS 9:22-24** 22 What if God, although choosing to show his wrath and make his power known, bore with great patience the objects of his wrath -prepared for destruction? 23 What if he did this to make the riches of his glory known to the objects of his mercy, whom he prepared in advance for glory— 24 even us, whom he also called, not only from the Jews but also from the Gentiles?

### God wasn't blessing Abraham and Jacob for their polygamy and deception. He was blessing all of humanity in spite of Abraham and Jacob's shortcomings.

## God loves humanity that much. He is a God of grace. He never breaks his promises.

## Deception begets deception.

## God accomplishes his plan for his glory, whether we choose to participate or not.

# 2 TIMOTHY 2:11-13

11 Here is a trustworthy saying: If we died with him, we will also live with him; 12 if we endure, we will also reign with him. If we disown him, he will also disown us; 13 if we are faithless, he remains faithful, for he cannot disown himself.
